

The Ministry of Sacristan


Sacristans (or ministers of altar care) are helpful to the priest in taking care to make sure that altar linens (corporals, purificators and towels) are cleaned, pressed and readily available for use at every Mass. Sacristans are also responsible for preparing the bread and wine before Mass, putting the sacred vessels away after Mass and checking to make sure that the sanctuary candle flame is always burning when the Body of Christ is present in the tabernacle. Ideally, we would like to have two dependable persons (or couples) to serve regularly as sacristans at Our Lady of the Mount, one person or couple for the Saturday vigil Mass and for the Sunday morning Mass, only one of whom would be responsible for cleaning and pressing the altar linens. Currently that role is filled by Sherma Dorsey, who does a great service to her fellow parishioners and her pastor. Thanks, Sherma!

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is the perfect Sunday to initiate a slight change in how we use the ringing of the bells at Mass. At every Mass there is a precise moment when the ordinary bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Christ. This moment, which varies depending on which Eucharistic prayer the priest uses, is called the epiclesis.

It is appropriate, though not required, at the epiclesis for there to be one quick sharp ring of the bells. This is the moment of transubstantiation, when the substance "crosses over" from one kind of substance (bread and wine) to another (the Body and Blood of Christ) while still in the appearance of bread and wine.

The Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit (God) that the gifts offered by our human hands (the bread and wine brought forward during the offertory) be consecrated, that is, become Christ's Body and Blood, and that the unblemished (without sin) sacrificial Victim (Christ) to be consumed by the faithful in Communion may be for the salvation of those who will partake of it.

In coming weeks, watch for the moment at every Mass when the priest holds his hands over the offerings and invokes the Holy Spirit to consecrate the bread and the wine. This is the moment of epiclesis.
