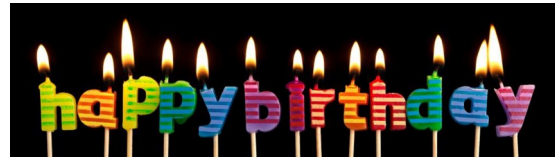
Readings for Next Sunday, September 25th
