

# O.C.I.A. is Coming in January 2025 (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Would you or someone you know like to learn more about the Catholic faith?

- -Perhaps your spouse or fiancé is thinking about becoming a Catholic?
- -Maybe you were raised Catholic, but never received the sacrament of Confirmation?
- -Maybe you have never been baptized by any Christian church or maybe you have never belonged to a faith community?
- -Maybe you've drifted away from the Church and want to renew your connection to Catholicism by refreshing your knowledge of the Church's teaching?
- -There is never any commitment to become Catholic. That is a personal decision to be made by each individual participant.
- Participants who decide to become Catholic will be brought into full communion with the Church (Confirmation) at the Easter Vigil, Saturday night, April 19, 2025.

# Hot Meals Ministry Update



"Jesus goes into the desert to bring "comfort" (Is 40:1), to seek the lost, to transform the desert into a place of hope. Just as God was present for forty years with the Israelites in the desert, giving them manna from heaven to eat and miraculous water to drink, so Jesus, the Rock, followed His people in the desert (1 Cor 10:4), nourishing and protecting them. He calls us to likewise comfort those in deserted places. We go where He goes, in search of lost sheep and Jesus transforms the desert and makes it bloom."
